FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FOR A PATIENT IN NEED

Although Marlys knew that there was a history of cancer in her family, she had a high deductible with her medical insurance and therefore kept putting off mammograms. Her older daughter kept encouraging her to go, reminding her that her aunt had a history of breast cancer, but she still didn't go.

Until one day her daughter saw a posting on Facebook that Carol Milgard Breast Center offered no cost mammograms to those in need, reminding everyone that money should not be a reason for putting off a mammogram – particularly if there is a history of breast cancer in the family.

Her daughter called and set up the appointment, and she went. When she received the call asking her to come back in for a biopsy, she was nervous and wasn't sure how she could afford it, but Carol Milgard Breast Center said she qualified for financial assistance and not to worry.

Marlys received the news that she had cancer following her biopsy. After about 8 weeks of radiation, she was cancer-free.

"If I had continued to hesitate, and my daughter hadn't pushed me, it could have been a lot worse. I am now a big advocate for getting checked and make sure my sister and daughters get checked as well."

Marlys now has Medicare, so her regular check-ups and mammograms are covered, but she wants to remind everyone that there's help if you need it, and not having insurance or a high deductible should never be reason for not getting a mammogram.
